


VIEW FROM ENS CAB

Another Summer Gone! Did you get everything done you wanted to? I did not which does not surprise me. I've planned every year to do this or that and have yet to do this or that!



On the New Buffalo Turntable

What: Division One Spring outing for members and family When: Saturday, June 8<sup>th</sup> - 8 AM-3 PM

Who: Approximately 20 members and an additional 7 family members (wives and children) Where: Steam Railroading Institute of Owasso in Owasso MI and a side trip to Durand MI to an active Train Station.

We were greeted by Dean Pyers, representing the <u>Steam Railroading Institute of Owasso</u>. He gave us an overview of the facility and encouraged us to enjoy their indoor museum displays. A brown bag picnic lunch followed. Dean led us on a tour of the back lot and repair shed where he explained the repair and restoration capabilities they have at this site. He highlighted the New Buffalo Turntable and the Detroit, Toledo & Ironton/Grand Trunk #15027 Burro Crane both of which are in active use. We walked to the shed where we could observe their people rebuilding the Pere Marquette #1225, the largest operating steam locomotive in Michigan. Its other claim to fame was its staring role in The Polar Express.

Our next event was a great train ride complete with re-enactors and a train robbery. We rode behind **a** Vulcan 0-4-0 steam locomotive switcher to the edge of town and back to the Owosso station. We also noted their extensive outdoor collection of cars and locomotives.

The short trip from Owosso to Durand took about 20 min. Durand features a working diamond crossing of tracks. The Durand Union Station, a functioning Amtrak station, is home to the <u>Michigan Railroad History Museum</u>. Our group had time to explore this historic depot and all the indoor displays including an HO model train layout complete with a scale model of the station. The observation platform provided a great view for the many trains that normally pass through town each day, but to our dismay only one train came through town during our visit.

We would like to offer our sincere thanks to Dean for organizing our visit and sharing his commentary and background information. His knowledge and welcome made this a really enjoyable day for all of us.


