
View From the Cab November 2014


That in it's self was a testament to the workmanship for one very simple reason and that being, their were VISITORS present. In other words, this day, Murphy took a back seat!

Could this be London?




Check out the derail on the right side of the above picture. Hope the guy in the cab is paying attention!
