


One of the thoughts I've had during some down time is; I wonder if someone out there has the item I've






PS - From the Editor's desk


In my Editors column, I mentioned I was building a small building to hide a switch machine. Here's a couple of pictures showing that project.

Thanks Steve for your contribution - it's that easy, won't you give it a try?

I'm sure everyone knows what a refrigerator car is. It's like an insulated boxcar with either ice bunkers or a mechanical refrigeration unit for cooling. However, circa 1969, the Northern Pacific and ACF Industries were completing test runs of 61 refrigerated covered hoppers. That's right, refrigerated covered hoppers. They were meant to replace the bulk handling of various types of produce.

Up until then, all produce was bagged or boxed, then stacked on a pallet which was then loaded into a refrigerator car for transport to its destination, where the pallets were unloaded. The produce was then hand unloaded from the pallets and packaging before being dumped into large bins at the processors plants.

The idea was to eliminate all the extra handling to save costs.

The Santa Fe ordered 100 of the cars in 1972.

The cars lasted less than 10 years in service. The problem? No one took into account what happens to 100 tons of bulk produce when subjected to the rigors of rail transportation. The bouncing, shaking and vibrations. In the case of the Santa Fe, when used in bulk potato service, the potatoes came out badly bruised, crushed and almost mashed when the discharge gates were opened. Similar results were had with bulk fruits, oranges, grape fruit, etc.

After removal from bulk produce service, the cars had their refrigeration and diesel units removed and placed into general grain service.


Another problem that appeared in their later lives, that greatly shortened their lives, was the foam insulation on the outside of the cars. Water would seep under it and start to cause to car bodies to begin rusting prematurely.

Santa Fe's cars were all off the roster by the early 1980's. Northern Pacific's cars didn't fair much better. Very few made it into the BN merger.

Fort Wayne Rail Heritage

Fort Wayne has a railroad history dating from 1852, when the first locomotive was brought here by canal boat. It was used in the construction of the rail line eastward; the first train arrived on October 31, 1854. Continued construction connected the city to Chicago and other points west. Fort Wayne became the home of many railroad shops. The best known was the Pittsburgh, Fort Wayne, and Chicago Railway shops (later the Pennsylvania). At the turn of the century, there were a dozen rail lines with 200 trains. Today, there are two companies and good traffic (not 200 though). In fact, the elevated route of the Nickel Plate (now Norfolk Southern) is on the canal bed just north of the central business district.


