## View from the Cab Feb 2018

### View from the Cab February 2018

Last month as I gazed from the cab, I talked about my recent efforts to streamline and organize my scenery materials, and how it contributed immediately to my modeling efforts. This month I'd like to share with you some thoughts about another modeling "process": how we go about learning to do new things. No, I don't mean techniques that haven't been done before, I mean learning to do things YOU haven't done before. (although in the process, you may very well develop some things that haven't been done). For example, at the February Black Swamp Division meeting, I'm going to show you what I've learned this month in my quest to model some specific trees. I saw that there were several established methods and many variations on them. There were some things I liked and some I didn't. What's right? What's the best? What should I do? Well, first I decided to be patient and do some experimenting, then narrow down what worked best. That took quite a bit of time, but once I settled on my preferred method, I could repeat much faster. Before I started, I did some online research and quickly found what trees I should focus on, based on my prototype area. For me, only five species will be needed to realistically model most of my woodland scenes. I scoured the internet looking for prototype photos and how-to videos, including YouTube and Trainmasters TV. I dug through a half dozen books, including those by Dave Frary, Lou Sassi, Woodland Scenics, and others. I made sure I had all the materials I might need on-hand at the beginning, which kept things moving. Then, and only then, I sat down at the workbench and actually used my hands. It is critical to break through that evaluation wall and get to the action! Do the homework, make some plans, and then GO! Don't let that paralysis by analysis stop you. (Trust me, I have a near-terminal case of this syndrome!) So fast forward: over a period of about 10 days, I produced four trees. Yeah, two each of two species. But most important, I REALLY LIKE THOSE TREES. That's the objective!

Now let me say this, I hope you like them too, but no offense, I don't really care. Model rail-roading is an art form, and this is my palette. But I do care about <a href="https://example.com/helping-you">helping-you</a> any way possible, so I want to share anything that might work for what you want to build. That's a big reason why we have Division One meetings. It's easier (and more fun) to "get better" at this together. So this month I did not do anything radical or invent something new, but I did move forward in my quest to build the best model railroad I can. It's all about the steps: take one, then another, keep moving, and enjoy some satisfaction along the way. Our railroads should not frustrate us. If they do, we need to rethink how we approach the effort, and I can tell you I'm making progress. I hope you are too.

I'm looking forward to seeing you at the next meeting on February 23. We had a record attendance at the January meeting, so call a friend to be sure he's coming and let's set a new one!


# AT OUR NEXT DIVISION MEETING




