
View from the Cab Feb 2018

View from the Cab March 2018


One of the great benefits of model railroading is the opportunity to try new and different things. I've been at this hobby since 1952, and I'm still exploring! One modern technology that has intrigued me is 3D printing, but I've been a bit intimidated by the process. First, you need to learn how to use appropriate software to design parts. Then you must apply other software to adapt a drawing file for use in the actual printing. You need to determine who will make your part and what material specifications are needed. Then, and only then, can you actually print your part! This past week, I grabbed the bull by the horns and plowed through the entire process for the first time. I was prompted by the need for multiple pieces of a unique part. As I model the railroads of Maine in 1950, several of my industries require flatbed truckloads of potato barrels. These barrels have a distinct size, shape, and band construction. I have photos and dimensions from the prototype, so I started drawing in Sketchup, a free 3d drawing program. Now Sketchup is not real sophisticated compared to other programs on the market, but I have it on hand, I have the "Dummies" book, and the price is right! Before I started drawing, I consulted the Shapeways website for advice on printing materials and appropriate dimensional specifications. (This is an important step to avoid wasting time drawing something that can't be printed!) After several hours of study and practice, I produced a 3D drawing for 50 barrels connected by sprues. I exported the file to another free program, Netfabb, to prep it for printability. Then I created a simple and instant free account at Shapeways so I could upload my file for evaluation. This is a no-obligation step that is very impressive. You can watch the Shapeways diagnostic tools evaluate your file in real time to identify any problems, then give you an exact price. My file went through with flying colors, but I went back and edited my drawing to reduce the sprue material by 67%. When I submitted the new file, it saved me \$7! It was really gratifying to hit the "Add to Cart" button. I should have my barrels in about a week and my file will remain in my personal account at Shapeways for future orders. Meanwhile, I can create and add any number of future files to my account. With what I learned on this project, I will be able to design parts much faster with better precision. I can continue to learn new tricks in Sketchup as needed for each job, and I am now confident in running the Netfabb and Shapeways processes. And one added bonus: I can provide my print-ready file to my network of Maine modeling friends who can then submit orders to Shapeways. All-in-all, I have really enjoyed this effort and I'm excited about the future potential for my modeling needs. And I think this runs to the heart of what we do at the Black Swamp Division and NMRA: keep trying new things and share what we learn with others.

One note about this coming meeting (Friday, March 23): Norm announced that the theme of Show-N-Tell will be something you bought at a train show. Now I know we've all been to many train shows, including the one at Owens College March 11. But I commented to Norm that I was skeptical that you guys would bring much stuff to share on this topic. Well, one thing led to another and Norm and I now have this raging debate that will have consequences. If at least 10 of you bring something for Show-N-Tell this month, I'll wear a Goofy hat for the rest of the meeting. (No, not a goofy hat, a <u>Goofy</u> hat.) If you don't come through, Norm has to sport the lid. I hope I'm wrong and I'll be happy to wear the silly thing if it means we've got a lot of cool stuff to see!

Stop and think about what you have and what you can handle. Having the guys to the house is great fun and a world of friendship for all to share in. But, every once in a while, I like to just play trains by myself. Am I being selfish or snotty? I don't think so! It's just that there are times when I'm alone and I want to be able to have control of the whole layout, not overwhelmed by it! I now look at it this way; small can be a real challenge and just what I'm about to take on. Hope to share more on this topic later!

Black Swamp Clinic Corner:


The February Division 1 clinics mainly covered how to make pine trees. Dave and I shared our first attempt at using different materials and we also watched a Trainmaster's clinic on how to


