
Layout of the Month

This month, Dave Miller's Z-scale empire is our featured layout. Following is Dave's description of his layout.

The Cascade Mountain Railroad is a large L-shaped Z-scale layout with mountainous scenery. I has a double helix and can operate 5 trains at once. Some of the more spectacular features include a working drive-in theater, a large and highly detailed refinery, and a container terminal. There are many small

detailed scenes. This layout was featured in the 1997 issue of Great Model Railroads, and was on the 2007 National Convention tour. Control is DC.

Those of you who have not seen Dave's layout at all, or recently, are in for a real treat. It is amazing how much railroading you can pack into a z-scale layout. Dave's layout will be open from 11 AM - 7 PM on Saturday, March 27, and from Noon -5 PM on Sunday, March 28. As usual, the address is in an email, and maps will be available at the meeting.


