

Tina and I hope everyone had a good Thanksgiving. She is now back from Florida and we thank everyone who helped me last meeting.

This month is our annual Christmas party and Chinese Auction.

As I brought up at the November meeting, I have received several complaints about the gifts.

Mostly about their "value", and "appropriateness". Several members have told me that that is why they no longer participate or even attend that meeting. As I said at the meeting, THINK about what you are going to bring. Is it something you would like to get? If you are not sure about what you are thinking about bringing, get a gift certificate or card. The receiver can then get what they can use. (That doesn't mean everyone bring one!)

Also remember, not all of our members model HO or N scales. I know that it is very difficult to find a gift in the other scales that fall into the price guide lines, but that is another reason to think about a gift certificate. Again the receiver can apply it towards something they can use. I encourage everyone coming to participate this year, no mater what scale you are in.

For those not familiar with the way our Chinese Auction works, a quick explanation.

Everyone bringing a wrapped gift (VALUE of \$10.00 to \$20.00) gets a number.

The person who draws the number 1 goes first. They pick any one gift off the table, and open it in front of everyone. They then draw the next number. That person has a choice. They can either open another gift, or take an already

opened gift. The Person losing their gift, then gets to either open another gift, or take someone else's gift. The only rule, you can't take back a gift you already had, but lost. After the last gift is opened, the person who went first can either keep what he has, or exchange what he has with anyone else, except if it was something he already had, but lost. Because of the Chinese Auction, there will be NO Show and Tell or Door Prizes this month. Also, everyone coming is encouraged to bring some kind of Christmas snack to share. One last item. Please tell me in advance at the meeting if you want any of your leftover snacks back.


We can't keep opened packages until the next meeting and last year I unknowingly gave opened leftovers away, before the person who brought them asked for them.
