

Currently, the layout is L shaped. One leg is 4' by 12' and the other leg is 4' by 10'. Scenery is 99% complete.

Highlights of the layout are the Gantlet thru truss bridge over the Coldwater river, the large ADM mill complex, and working signals. Most of the buildings have interiors with lights. Control is DCC, and the modeling era is the 1970's.

I will be open on Saturday from 1:00 pm to 6:00 pm. I'll have maps to my house at the meeting.


